- ❖ Care for your child's health, safety and well-being whilst in our care.

4.Do look after our things	<i>Don't waste or damage things</i>
5.Do be honest	<i>Don't tell lies or cover up the truth</i>
6.Do understand it's OK to make mistakes	<i>Don't laugh at those who are brave enough to have a go</i>
7.Do work hard and try your best	<i>Don't waste time or give up easily</i>

Parents/Guardians

I will:

- ❖ Support the Christian ethos of the school and encourage my child to do so.
- ❖ Ensure that my child attends school every day and on time.
- ❖ Ensure that my child is collected on time.
- ❖ Not take holidays during term time.
- ❖ Telephone the school to let them know if my child is sick.
- ❖ Allow my child to receive first aid or urgent medical treatment.
- ❖ Ensure that my child wears the school uniform and has a school PE kit available to wear as required.
- ❖ Ensure my child's book bag is brought to school every day.
- ❖ Support my child in homework and after-school learning opportunities.
- ❖ Allow my child access to the Internet at school (please see school e-safety policy, available from the school office).
- ❖ Not discuss school based issues, school staff, pupils or parents on social media sites eg What's App, Twitter, Facebook
- ❖ Make the school aware of any concerns or problems that might affect my child's school work or behaviour.
- ❖ Support the school's policies (available from the school office) including the behaviour policy and help to promote the Golden Rules.
- ❖ Conduct myself politely and appropriately whilst on school premises, behaving in a way that sets a good example to the children.
- ❖ Allow my child's photograph to be used on the school website and in newsletters.
- ❖ Attend parent meetings and discussions about my child's progress.
- ❖ Get to know about my child's life at school by reading school newsletters and talking to my child.
- ❖ Support school events and the Friends of St Luke's (FoSL) parent group.
- ❖ Make the annual voluntary contribution to the School Building Fund.

Department for Education guidance states that written consent from parents/carers is not needed for trips/off-site activities that are within school hours as these are part of the curriculum (with the exception of nursery age children). However, parents will be informed of trips in advance.

Parental consent will be requested for certain trips which are not part of the normal school day e.g. residential trips
