
'Magical Bones' Visits St. Luke's

What to do if your child develops symptoms of coronavirus. . .

A reminder that, if your child is displaying symptoms of coronavirus at home, you must arrange a test for them immediately and inform the school of the result. Children displaying symptoms will not be able to return to school without being tested.

- 1) To arrange a test you should visit nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test or call 119
- 2) **DO NOT WAIT!** Your child should be tested on the same day they are showing symptoms, or the next day at the latest.
- 3) Please let the Head of School (Mr Evans) know immediately when you receive the result of your child's coronavirus test by calling the school office on **0208 103 1780**
- 4) If your child tests positive for coronavirus, you will receive a text, email or phone call from NHS that explains what your result is and what you need to do next.
- 5) If your child tests negative for coronavirus, your child can return to school.

Change in Policy from Public Health England London on PCR testing of close contacts

An increase is being seen in the number of cases of Covid-19 in Westminster, Brent and across London.

Public Health England are now advising that close contacts of positive cases should now have a PCR test (arranged by themselves).

The advice is that close contacts still need to isolate for the ten days, but having a PCR test will help to identify any additional asymptomatic cases of Covid-19.

If the PCR result returns as negative, the close contacts still need to self-isolate for the full 10 days (due to the incubatory period of the virus).

So, the advice from today is for close contacts to self-isolate for ten days and arrange for a PCR test.
